# President's Committee 2010 Report on Corvette Roulette

This report was produced by the Las Vegas Corvettes Association President's Committee aimed at providing relevant information to an E-Board decision to possibly continue the annual Corvette Roulette, CR, event in the future. This committee was selected by the president, Sherrie Wood, and is made up of Irene Duis, Cathy Wilson, Sharron Grodzinsky, Bob O'Brian, Ken Rees and Dale Foust. Many thanks to each committee member for the enthusiastic support given to the production of this report. I want to recognize and apologize for our inability to meet the desired publication date for this report due to my unplanned surgery. I hope it will be useful in any case.

This report is divided into two sections. Part A is a summary of relevant numerical and sometimes statistical quantitative parameters that describe past CR events. This section summarizes financial, participation, and supporting functions aimed at understanding the scope and performance of these past events as reference material for a decision to continue or not. Part B is a summary of a survey conducted by the committee to determine the view of Corvette Roulette, Past or future, by the LVCA membership. This was essentially an opinion survey aimed at evaluating, in detail, the memberships position regarding the success of past CR events and then determining their support of continuing the event in the future.

The committee wishes to recognize the support of many LVCA members in making this report possible and we wish to specifically thank Sherrie Wood, Carl Hastings, Jeff Blue, Pat Russell and Carol Gagliardi for the extra effort they put forth on our behalf.

# Presidents Committee Summary Report Corvette Roulette

This summary report is intended to be a short statement of the major conclusions drawn from the data that provided input to this committee's study. The full report contains the source documents so that one can evaluate this information in detail in order to support any decision which may be based upon it. The full report is in excess of 50 pages.

This report is divided into two parts. Part A contains the quantitative information flowing from the past Corvette Roulette, CR, events. Due to it's proximity in time much of the 2010 event information is not yet available but will be provided to the E-board about the same time as this report. This will require some integration by the board to incorporate that data into any final conclusions.

A portion of Section A contains the financial reports for years 2006 through 2009. A major conclusion flowing from a review of this data is that gross income and net income both experienced significant reductions over the years. This is a direct result of lower participation over the subject years. This trend can be seen in the Corvette Roulette Historical Summary that follows. One can note that the number of volunteers used to manage these events has also gone down but remains a similar portion of the total LVCA membership with slight year to year variations. The largest changes occurred from 2006 to 2007 and the changes since than have been smaller.

The committee could not find an explicit statement of the original CR objective but in reading much of the documentation we concluded that it was generally to 1. Provide an income stream to LVCA, 2. Draw attendance from a large geographical area, 3. Enhance the prestige of LVCA and 4. Make contributions to selected charities. Verbal discussions with past CR event leaders indicate there may well have been others but I cannot find where they may have been accepted. The data suggests that these central objectives were at best only partially attained.

Part B of this report is focused on the survey written by the committee and sent to the LVCA membership. This survey was aimed at determining a variety of opinions and impressions this group may have regarding past and potential future Corvette Roulette events. In General one must read the survey results to get a clear impression of the opinions held by the LVCA members. It can be said that there were 69 specific responses to the survey and we have been told that many of those represent the views of a husband and wife team. This suggests that over 100 people may have their responses included and that is a significant and meaningful data set upon which to draw valid conclusions or to base any decision. The majority of respondents were positive on what we perceived to be key issues. For example, 80% felt CR has been successful, 73% have attended and had fun, 88% felt fees were fair, 82% would like to see the event continue, 57% would attend next year.

The optimism of this survey seems to be a bit at odds with some of the information obtained in the fore mentioned conversations with CR leadership. In general this information indicates that few people want to get involved in the work of organizing and conducting these events. Furthermore it seems that many of the same people work much of the time and burnout is an issue. This dichotomy should be considered when interpreting the data in this report.

A great deal of data in this report flows from the comments made in several venues including the CR committee survey. They address suggestions relevant to organization and duty assignment and ranging to event operating details. We find these comments do not lend themselves to summary conclusions so the responses should be read and considered as a separate yet critical data set.

The committee hopes this report meets the needs of LVCA leadership and we stand ready to answer questions or support the leadership in any way.

## Corvette Roulette Report

## Past Attendance per Year

The attendance data for the four past Corvette Roulettes show how many cars were registered broken out by members and guests (for example in 2006 there were 60 LVCA member cars, 54 guest cars), but only a total for how many people attended (2006 = 226), not broken out by LVCA members and guests. Some cars accompanied one person, some accompanied two people. Based on this, the total LVCA members who attended would be somewhere between the actual number of cars (single person) and twice the number of cars (couples). Since there is no way to know how many there were of each, the attendance numbers are listed as a range.

LVCA membership totals were taken from the minutes in the NewsVetters.

## 2006, October 5 - 8

60 LVCA cars were entered.

Between 60 and 120 members entered.

There were approximately 286 members in October 2006.

Between 21% and 42% of the membership entered.

## <u>2007</u>, August 21-September 2

54 LVCA cars were entered.

Between 54 and 108 members entered.

There were approximately 285 members in September 2007.

Between 19% and 38% of the membership entered.

#### 2008, May 23-25

51 LVCA cars were entered.

Between 51 and 102 members entered.

There were approximately 250 members in May 2008.

Between 20% and 41% of the membership entered.

#### 2009, May 22-24

58 LVCA cars were entered.

Between 58 and 116 members entered.

There were approximately 252 members in May 2009.

Between 23% and 46% of the membership entered.

According to the survey results, 85.2% of the membership attended at least one of the four Corvette Roulettes. 73.8% volunteered at least one event.

#### Summary

Attendance at the four Corvette Roulettes has only decreased slightly. A high percentage of the membership participated and volunteered in at least one event.

I have been involved with the Corvette Roulette event since before it was called the Corvette Roulette event. I have been an active member of the planning committee for every Corvette Rolette event. I have seen the stress it has inflicted on the members of the planning committees and believe I am witnessing burnout of the key members that have participated in the past CR events. One of the original objectives of the planning committee was to spread the responsibilities to as many people as possible, and to require that every key planning committee position must have a deputy. This was intended to reduce the stress and the risk of burnout. This objective has all but disappeared in the last five years and we are now seeing the negative consequences.

The concept of a sustainable and successful annual Corvette Roulette event is going to be difficult if not impossible if there is not a Corvette Roulette Director position created. Currently, each CR event is a stand-alone exercise. Each year a new CR Chair and planning committee is selected and a random set of some of the documentation from the past CR events are placed into the archives. Each new planning committee is doomed to re-invent the wheel unless someone on the planning committee remembers what might or might not have happened in the past. The duties of the CR Director should include:

- · Recruiting candidates for the next CR Chair
  - Capturing the lessons learned from each CR event

  - Maintaining a best practices file
    Direct the Participants Satisfaction Survey for each CR event
  - · Work with the E-Board to maintain:
  - o A current set of CR event objectives
  - o A current concept of an ongoing annual CR event
  - o A current description of the CR activities
  - o A current approach to planning and conducting the CR event
  - Capture and make available to future planning committees all relevant documentation from past CR events.

If all that the CR event does is to package the normal LVCA activities into a single weekend event, than it should NOT be continued. (See #9 above.)



The duties of the CR Director should include:

- · Maintaining a best practices file
- Direct the Participants Satisfaction Survey for each CR event
- · Work with the E-Board to maintain:
- o A current set of CR event objectives
- o A current concept of an ongoing annual CR event

- o A current approach to planning and
- conducting the CR event
- Capture and make available to future planning committees all relevant documentation from past CR events.
